

TIMELINE: NEW TESTAMENT BOOKS

LUKE: Dr. Robert Lindsey, who spent 43 years studying and ministering in Israel, began working on a translation of the Gospel of Mark. In the course of his research, he concluded that the Greek Synoptic Gospels were dependent on an earlier written account in Hebrew – which could have been the Gospel of Luke.

NOTES: 1) This timeline chart was compiled using various sources, including the Holman Christian Standard Bible, and writings of Dr. Daniel Wallace. They could not all be followed exactly as they differ in some respects, but those differences are not critical for the purpose for which this timeline has been drawn up (often it differs by a year or so). It does not change the reality of a date before the destruction of Jerusalem and the temple by the Roman army under Titus in 70 AD.

2) The late dates for the Johannine writings and the Revelation that some scholars hold onto are given for the sake of the knowledge of their differences. After studying the overwhelming evidence for the late dates against that for the earlier dating, I personally have no hesitation to accept the earlier dating.
